**RE:** CC Docket No. 96-45 – Joint Petition of Twin Valley Telephone, Inc., United Telephone Company of Kansas, and United Telephone Company of Eastern Kansas for Waiver of The Definition of “Study Area” of the Appendix-Glossary of Part 36 of the Commission’s Rules

Dear Ms. Dortch:

In connection with the referenced Joint Petition, filed October 26, 2005, the following information is being furnished on behalf of United Telephone Company of Kansas (UTCK) and United Telephone Company of Eastern Kansas (UTCEK) (collectively, “United”) in response to a request by Gary Seigel of the Commission’s staff.

Of the thirteen exchanges being sold by United to Twin Valley Telephone, Inc., three – Aurora, Green, and Morganville – are in the United Telephone Company of Eastern Kansas study area (USAC Reference No. 411317). The remaining ten exchanges – Clifton, Clyde, Delphos, Glasco, Leonardville, Longford, Milford, Olsburg, Riley and Wakefield – are in the United Telephone Company of Kansas study area (USAC No. 411842). For each study area, United has calculated the annualized amount of Interstate Access Support, based on December 2005 data, received for each study area before and after the sales of these exchanges. Those results are shown in the table below.
