APPLICATION FOR AUTHORITY TO DISCONTINUE SERVICE

Questar InfoComm, Inc. ("Questar"), by its attorneys, hereby respectfully requests authority pursuant to Section 214(a) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended (the "Act"), 47 U.S.C. § 214(a), and Section 63.71 of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. § 63.71, to discontinue provision of interstate and international interexchange telecommunications service. At the present time, Questar provides interexchange service to approximately 100 subscribers, all of whom are located in the State of Utah. However, it plans to discontinue offering interexchange service upon approval of this application. In support of the application, Questar provides the following information in accordance with the requirements of Section 63.71 of the Commission's rules.

1. Name and Address of the Carrier

Questar InfoComm, Inc.

2. Date of Planned Discontinuance of Service

Questar plans to discontinue interexchange service not later than March 1, 2006 subject to approval of this discontinuance application.

3. Points of Geographic Areas Affected

Questar's interexchange service is offered only to customers located in Utah. Interexchange calls may be terminated throughout the United States as well as to foreign points.

4. Description of Type of Service Affected

By this application, Questar requests authority only to discontinue interexchange service. Currently, Questar provides outbound toll service, including "1+" calling service, dedicated outbound service, travel card service and personal 800 service, to approximately 100 customers located in the State of Utah. Questar's interstate private line services will continue to be offered.

5. Customer Notification

On January 25, 2006, Questar sent via U.S. first class mail a notification to each of its interexchange service customers containing the information required by Section 63.71. A copy of that notice is attached hereto.

6. Classification of Carrier

Questar is a non-dominant carrier pursuant to the Commission's rules.

7. Notification to Governmental Agencies and Departments

Pursuant to Section 63.71(a) of the Commission's rules, copies of this application have been served on the Utah Public Service Commission, the Governor of the State of Utah, and the Secretary of Defense, Special Assistant for Telecommunications.

CONCLUSION

For the reasons described herein, Questar respectfully requests that this application for discontinuance of interexchange telecommunications service be approved.

Dear Star LD Customer,

Previously you received a letter notifying you that effective December 31, 2005 Questar InfoComm would no longer provide its Star LD long-distance service. Due to various delays that date has been postponed to February 28, 2006. You will continue to be billed for any usage between December 31, 2005 and February 28, 2006.

As a Star LD customer, you may be using any or all of the following services: 1+ dialing, the Star LD Travel Card, Personal Inbound 800, or Dedicated 800 service. You will need to switch to a new long-distance provider before February 28, 2006 if you haven't already done so. **If you do not make this change by the new effective date, you will not be able to make long-distance calls from your home phone.** Other long-distance providers or your local telephone provider can assist you with this change. Contact information can be found in the front section of your local telephone book.

After you have become a customer of your new long-distance provider and have been established in its system, your local telephone provider will notify Questar InfoComm. We thank you for being a Star LD customer and regret any inconvenience this decision may cause. If you have questions, please call customer service at 324-1936 (local Salt Lake area) or toll free at 800-341-7827.

The Federal Communications Commission requires the following statement: **the FCC will normally authorize this proposed discontinuance of service unless it is shown that customers would be unable to receive service or a reasonable substitute from another carrier or that the public convenience and necessity is otherwise adversely affected. If you wish to object, you should file your comments within 15 days of receipt of this notification. Address them to the Federal Communications Commission, Washington, DC 20554, referencing the Sec. 63.71 Application of Questar. Comments should include specific information about the impact of this proposed discontinuance upon you or your company, including any inability to acquire reasonable substitutable service.**


