Dear Ms. Dortch:

On March 14, 2006, John Taylor, Vice President of Government Relations and Communications for LG Electronics USA, Inc. ("LG") met with Heather Dixon, Legal Advisor to Chairman Martin. Mr. Taylor was accompanied by Richard Wiley of Wiley Rein & Fielding LLP and the undersigned.

During the meeting, LG discussed its concerns with the "Petition for Reconsideration and Clarification" filed by PDI Communications Systems, Inc. ("PDI") which seeks relief from the Commission's rules requiring digital tuners in television receivers with screen sizes less than 13 inches as mandated by the agency's Second Report and Order adopted in the above-referenced docket. LG explained that granting PDI a waiver of the DTV tuner mandate, or even an extension of time within which to comply with the rule, would set a dangerous precedent, undermining the digital television transition and FCC's goal of maximizing the number of television receivers with DTV tuners on the market as quickly as possible. The company explained that because LG and other manufacturers sell receivers to the healthcare industry, relieving PDI from the DTV tuner mandate's requirements would unfairly place LG and those manufacturers who are working diligently to comply with the law at a competitive disadvantage.
