Dear Mr. Martin:

As the FCC approaches its decision deadline on proceedings related to the proposed Intelsat/PanAmSat merger, I would like to reiterate on behalf of ITSO's member States my call on you and the other Commissioners to protect the continuity of satellite public service provisions. As noted in previous Comments and Reply Comments to the merger proceeding, ITSO has urged the FCC to condition the merger on prompt implementation of mechanisms to ensure the survivability of Intelsat's Public Service Obligations, and to preserve the integrity of the Common Heritage orbital locations and associated frequency spectrum, in the event of a voluntary or involuntary Intelsat bankruptcy proceeding.

ITSO understands that Intelsat is claiming that the merger benefits its Public Service Obligations. However Intelsat, since January 2005, has taken a number of actions contrary to its fulfillment of these obligations. Intelsat deleted all references to the Public Service Obligations from its corporate bye-laws, stopped providing information to enable ITSO to assess Intelsat's compliance with its Public Service Obligations, denied the right for small customers in developing countries to benefit from competitive prices, and decreased satellite coverage in several sensitive regions, including Asia and Africa.

The United States initiated the creation of INTELSAT to promote the flow of information, peace and understanding in the world through global access to satellite services. Throughout its 40-year history, this Organization has benefited from the

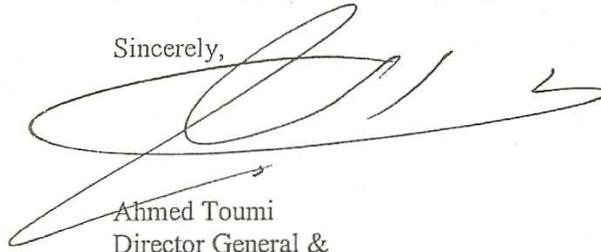
