ORDER ON PRETRIAL SUBMISSIONS¹

Exhibits and Written Testimony

1. Complainants and Gulf Power will submit written direct testimony and lists of proposed exhibits on **March 31, 2006**.
2. After exchanges of proposed exhibit lists, Complainants and Gulf Power shall confer in order to eliminate duplicative exhibits. The parties shall file on **April 6, 2006**, Complainants' and Respondent's documentary exhibits in three-ring binders, with each exhibit bearing a number and tab; and with each exhibit separately paginated. Each binder also shall contain an index, and exhibits shall be serially numbered for identification beginning with the number 1, preceded by a prefix (e.g., Comp. Exh. 1; Resp. Exh 1; EB Exh. 1).
3. If a document is included on the exhibit lists of both parties, then only the party which created or generated such exhibit shall include that exhibit in its binder.

¹ This *Order* is issued on submission by Complainants and e-mails of counsel, and has been modified as seen necessary by the Presiding Judge. This *Order* modifies but does not supplant prior *Order* FCC 05M-60, released December 16, 2005.

4. Exhibits identified on proposed exhibit lists and included in exhibit binders must include all exhibits that the parties intend to introduce in their cases-in-chief. The parties may but are not required to list or identify in advance, exhibits to be used in cross-examination.

Expert Discovery

5. Complainants will produce documents on expert discovery by **April 4, 2006**, and Gulf Power will produce documents on expert discovery by **April 7, 2006**.
