Re: Notice of De-Tariffing of DSL Service

Dear Customer:

Pursuant to an August 5, 2005 Order of the Federal Communications Commission ("FCC"), companies like SureWest Telephone ("SureWest") may now offer services like Digital Subscriber Line Solutions ("DSL") on a "de-tariffed" basis, rather than by use of a tariff, which is the basis under which SureWest currently provides your DSL service. The FCC requires companies that de-tariff their offering of DSL service to notify their customers, which is being done with this letter.

This de-tariffing of service will not change the speed of DSL service, and will not change the rates, terms or conditions of the service currently provided to you. You will continue to receive the same high-quality DSL service you currently receive, at the same monthly rate. Pursuant to the above-referenced FCC Order, increases to these rates will not be allowed until after November 16, 2006. Currently, there are no plans to increase these rates at that time. Although the service offering is being de-tariffed, the rates, terms and conditions of service will be available at [www.surw.com/regulatory/](http://www.surw.com/regulatory/), and a printed copy will also be available for review during normal business hours at SureWest Telephone's office located at 200 Vernon Street, Roseville, CA.

Consistent with the notification requirements established by the FCC, SureWest informs you that this de-tariffing of DSL service is planned to become effective on May 9, 2006, and will apply to all customers located in those portions of the communities of Roseville, Rocklin, Antelope, Citrus Heights, Fair Oaks, Orangevale, and Granite Bay, all communities located in California, that are within the serving area of SureWest Telephone.
