

Dear Sir/Madam:

I am writing to appeal the rejection by USAC of the District's original appeal to deny our Forms 471 application for e-rate funding because the requests were submitted after the closing date of the 2005-06 filing window.

As stated in my January 25, 2006 letter to USAC, the sole reason our Forms 471 were filed after the deadline was the death of our Director of Technology, Sharon Sharp, on February 19, 2005. Ms. Sharp was the district employee responsible for completing e-rate applications.

The letter to USAC also indicated that the District had filed 471 forms for cellular and POTS services only, which was a significant reduction from the firewall, file server, 2 routers and 2 file server operating systems additionally requested in the form 470 filed in December 2004. This was done to indicate the District's willingness to seek a mutually acceptable solution with USAC. Unfortunately, USAC did not address any of the above items in its rejection letters, choosing only to point out that the 471 forms were filed after the deadline. This fact was not being disputed by the District; in fact, I acknowledged it in my letter.

Based on the benefits the Garvey School District has received from the e-rate program since 1998, it would be disappointing if your agency does not grant our appeal based on the extenuating circumstances I have described. A denied appeal would result in a significant financial hardship to a district that qualifies for the maximum e-rate discount.

I am writing to appeal the decision stated in your letters dated November 29, 2005, in which the district's Forms 471 application for e-rate funding was denied because our requests were submitted after the closing date of the 2005-06 filing window.

The sole reason our Forms 471 were filed after the deadline was the death of our Director of Technology, Sharon Sharp, on February 19, 2005. Ms. Sharp was the district employee responsible for completing e-rate applications. The form 470 was filed by Ms. Sharp on December 16, 2004. Shortly thereafter, she was diagnosed with cancer; her last day of work was January 5, 2005. Having started my position with the district on September 1, 2004, I was not yet aware of the requirements and deadlines regarding the e-rate process.

The Form 470 filed in December 2004 included a request for a firewall, file server, 2 routers and 2 file server operating systems, in addition to cellular and POTS services. However, the district has reduced its 471 requests to cellular and POTS services.

The Garvey School District has been an active participant in the e-rate process since 1998. Our Form 470 for 2006-07 has already been filed. The circumstances surrounding the late filing of the Forms 471 are clearly an aberration. Denial of our appeal would impose a significant financial hardship in a district that qualifies for the maximum discount.

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




