**Re: Hearing Aid Compatibility Status
WT Docket No. 01-309**

Dear Ms. Giancarlo:

Pursuant to your request, Texas RSA-1 Limited Partnership d/b/a XIT Wireless (“XIT”), by its attorney, hereby informs the Federal Communications Commission (“Commission”) that it is availing itself of the relief afforded to wireless carriers and manufacturers by the Commission in the *GSM Relief Order*.¹ XIT submits that as of September 30, 2005 it has met the following conditions: (1) adopted and implemented an acceptable, flexible return policy for consumers seeking to obtain the hearing aid compatible (“HAC”) GSM handsets XIT offers; and (2) made current technical and anecdotal information available to the public regarding the hearing aid compatibility of specific GSM handsets it offers for sale. XIT also confirms that, effective September 30, 2005, the Motorola V3 (Razr) handsets XIT offers for sale are labeled with the performance rating of the handset and the associated packaging contains the technical specifications of the handset and description of the U-rating system. XIT also confirms that the Nokia 6061 handsets XIT offers for sale are labeled with the performance rating of the handset and the associated packaging contains the technical specifications of the handset and description of the U-rating system. XIT will provide detailed information on the status of its efforts to provide dual-band handsets that will be HAC in the 850 MHz band as well as the 1900 MHz band, and on the status of its continued efforts to comply with the aforementioned return policy and consumer outreach conditions, in its May 17, 2006 HAC compliance report.

¹ In the Matter of Section 68.4(a) of the Commission’s Rules Governing Hearing Aid-Compatible Telephones, *Memorandum Opinion and Order*, WT Docket No. 01-309 (September 7, 2005) (“*GSM Relief Order*”). The Commission ruled that it would accept until August 1, 2006 the HAC compliance rating for 1900 MHz operation as the overall compliance rating for dual-band GSM digital wireless handsets that operate in both the 850 MHz and 1900 MHz bands.
