**Re: Notice of Ex Parte – Regulation of Prepaid Calling Card Services,

Dear Ms. Dortch:

On May 4, 2006, Bob Quinn, Eric Einhorn and the undersigned, representing AT&T, Inc. (AT&T), met with Sam Feder, Mathew Berry, Joel Marcus, Nick Bourne, Chris Killion, and Diane Griffin of the Office of General Counsel to discuss the Commission's above-referenced rulemaking on prepaid calling cards. During the meeting, AT&T reiterated its position that the Commission should rule that all prepaid calling card services are subject to access charge and universal service obligations on a going forward basis.<sup>1</sup> We also encouraged the Commission to expressly rule that such obligations do not apply on a retroactive basis to the types of enhanced prepaid calling cards that are the subject of the Commission's notice of proposed rulemaking in this docket. All of the matters discussed during the meeting were consistent with AT&T's previous submissions in this docket.
