Dear Commission's Secretary:

I do hereby submit comments addressing issues raised in the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking ("NPRM") in the above referenced proceeding. In the NPRM, the Federal Communications Commission ("FCC" or "Commission") asked for comments regarding proposed changes to the Commission's existing rules governing the licensing and use of frequencies in the 904-909.75 MHz and 919.75-928 MHz portions of the 902-928 MHz band. I believe that preserving the "safe harbor" provisions for unlicensed Part 15 devices is essential and that expanding the permissible uses of the licensed part of the band would undermine requisite interference protection for unlicensed Part 15 devices. Utilities and their customers rely on the 902-928 MHz band to promote the efficient reading and use of water supply.

Given the amount of investment made by Utilities in its AMR system and its reliance on the system to control energy resources, I oppose any change to the M-LMS rules.
