

Kinsley

Kinsley is the county seat of Edwards [ED] County. It calls itself the "Midway City" because, according to the sign in the roadside park, it's 1561 miles from both New York and San Francisco. During the thirties, the cover on one issue of the Saturday Evening Post featured this sign. The town is located near the junction of Coon Creek and the Arkansas River. The river south of here could be jumped by a moderately athletic person.

Downtown Kinsley is really compact with narrow streets. The main street, Sixth Street where the Carnival Mall is, is one-way. City Hall, near downtown is fairly new. South of downtown along highway 183, there is a large city park and fairgrounds. Along East Seventh Street there are many large older homes.

Kinsley has both a country club (south of town) and a trap club (at the airport).

- The stone and yellow brick Edwards County Courthouse has a neat little decorative balcony over the front doors. It's well away from downtown at 3rd & Massachusetts; you have to cross the tracks and US-56.
- There is a roadside park in Kinsley where US-50 and 56 join. It has the Edwards County museum, AT&SF steam locomotive #3424, an old church, and a sod house. The church used to be at Centerview south of Lewis. The park also has a red stone DAR marker about the Santa Fe trail, picnic tables, playground equipment, and public rest rooms.
- The train station at Kinsley is not used anymore but it is a baroque confection of stone and brick that surely was once a source of great local pride.
- The Palace Theatre on Sixth Street is still in business.
- Local artists Bruce White, woodcarver, [659-2514] and John Winter, glassblower, [659-2225] will demonstrate their crafts.
- East of Kinsley on US 50, there is a historical marker describing the battle of Coon Creek. When you stop, notice the unusual little hills around. They look like little sand dunes covered with grass.

► History

Kinsley is on the Santa Fe trail near where it divides into the "Wet" and "Dry" routes. The army fought

a battle against Indians near here at the 1848 battle of Coon Creek to protect this route. The soldiers used "new-fangled" breechloading rifles to defeat the attacking Indians; this seems to be the first use of breechloaders in combat by United States troops.

The town was founded by emigrants from Massachusetts in 1873; they named it for E. W. Kinsley of Boston. Edwards County is named for W. C. Edwards, who built a block of brick buildings in early downtown Kinsley.

About the Kinsley Library

Seventy years ago, in January 1927, the city assumed financial support of the public library. But, for forty years or more before then, Kinsley had had a library for the use of the public.

The best remembered early location of the library was the corner of the millinery shop operated by the Misses Myrton and Morton (Myrt and Mort) Schnatterly. A gift of books from the Christian Endeavor Society of the Congregational Church added to the collection in the library.

When the Schnatterlys closed their shop, the library was moved to the balcony of the Edwards and Noble Store (on the southwest corner of the intersection of Marsh Avenue and Sixth Street) and, in 1925, to the north room in the high school gymnasium.

At the program in the gymnasium celebrating the opening, Harry Schnatterly had this to say concerning the development of the library:

"The Wednesday Night Club, with the support of other clubs, kept the library open for many years. It couldn't have been done without the dedication of the late Margaret Hills, who, for many of those years, acted as librarian.

"The Wednesday Night Club put on the first big Shakespearian play, *Midsummer Night's Dream* for the library fund. Leila Morse Hamilton was president at that time and Gilmore Brown came to produce the play." (Gilmore Brown went on to found the Pasadena Playhouse, where many prominent actors, particularly movie actors, got their training.)

With Jessie Fravel as librarian, the library was a busy place. The financial responsibility of the sponsoring clubs was great and the members began working for city tax support. In April, 1926, city voters approved a mill levy for the library, to take effect the following January. To signify the union of the library and the city, the clubs of Kinsley celebrated by staging a mock wedding, with a script written by Nell Lewis Woods, in the home of Mrs. Roy Hatfield.

Miss Fravel continued as librarian until May, 1927, when Mrs. Lillie Riley took her place. In 1941, a fire destroyed the high

school building and damaged the gymnasium. The library's new home was the second floor of what was then the City Hall and Fire Station (on the east side of Marsh just south of Fifth Street). A few months later, Mrs. Riley resigned and was replaced by Mrs. Elsie Jenkins.


In 1954, the library moved once more, this time to the newly built City Hall and Library Building, on a site at Eighth and Marsh donated by Mr. and Mrs. Edward Lippoldt. Mrs. Lippoldt donated the furniture for the Children's Room.

Mrs. Jenkins continued as librarian until her death in 1967. She was succeeded by Mrs. Edna Brown, who retired in 1972 and was replaced by Beverly J. Craft. After her retirement in 1997, Joan Weaver was appointed library director.

During the years of the library's existence, it has benefited many times from the generosity of its friends and patrons. Donations to the library have included books, records, paintings, furniture and equipment. Several local citizens have remembered the library in their wills. In addition, the collection has grown appreciable through gifts of memorial books.





Description

This is prairie country. Much of Edwards County is covered with a sandy soil used to produce alfalfa. Huge piles of hay are everywhere. Small hills that look like grass-covered sand dunes are also common.

- There is a **roadside park in Kinsley** where US-50 and 56 join; it contains the county museum, AT&SF steam locomotive number 3424, an old church, and a sod house. The park also has a red stone DAR marker about the Santa Fe trail and public rest rooms.
- The stone and yellow brick **Edwards County Courthouse** in Kinsley has a neat balcony over the front doors. It's well away from downtown at 3rd & Massachusetts; you have to cross the tracks and US-56.
- East of Kinsley on US 50, there is a historical marker describing the 1848 **battle of Coon Creek**. When you stop, notice the unusual little hills around you.
- **Fellsburg** is almost gone, but it does have a new home and several nicely maintained older ones. There is a brick building beside the paved road that looks like it used to be a bank; it's still in use.
- **Trousdale** is almost a ghost town, but it still has a brick Methodist church and an old elevator. On the east side of Trousdale there are the ruins of two old shop buildings and a horse drawn road grader marked "Adams Road Patrol No 4 / J. D. Adams & Co. Indianapolis USA" For more about the town see *Faded Dreams: More Ghost Towns of Kansas*, page 218.
- **Centerview**, south, of Lewis has nearly vanished, but there is an interesting palisade fence, and the steps up to a long-gone building. A church once here was moved to the roadside park in Kinsley.
- **Ardell**, west of Kinsley on US 50, used to be a big enough town to have a station. Now two rusting and abandoned "tin" elevators are all that's left.

History



Organized in 1874. County seat Kinsley. Named in honor of John H. Edwards, of Ellis, State Senator. Colonel Edwards removed from Kansas to New Mexico.

Long before the county was settled, travelers used the Santa Fe trail through this area. During the Mexican War, a detachment of soldiers was attacked while using the trail near the site that was to become Kinsley.

By the 1870s, it was clear that a railroad would follow the trail, and permanent settlers arrived. Edwards County was actually named for W. C. Edwards, who built a block of buildings in Kinsley during its early days.

William G. Cutler's *History of Kansas*, first published in 1883, tells about early Edwards County.

The Special Collections of the Ablah Library at WSU contain historical images of Trousdale, Lewis, Belpre, and Kinsley.

The Kansas State Historical Society also has [more historical data](#) for Edwards County online including a rich bibliography and lists of cemeteries, post offices, and newspapers.


