Dear Ms. Dortch:

On Thursday, June 1, 2006, Lawrence Krevor, Vice President, Government Affairs – Spectrum, Sprint Nextel Corporation (“Sprint Nextel”), Marc Martin, Kirkpatrick & Lockhart Nicholson Graham LLP, counsel to Sprint Nextel, Susan Fox, Vice President, Government Relations, The Walt Disney Company (“Disney”), and I met with David Furth, Michael Wilhelm, and Herbert Zeiler of the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau, and Geraldine Matise, Nicholas Oros, Jamison Prime, and Alan Scime of the Office of Engineering and Technology, to address the clearing of Broadcast Auxiliary Service (“BAS”) facilities from the 1990-2025 MHz band pursuant to 800 MHz band reconfiguration. In particular, we discussed the recent agreement of Sprint Nextel and the ABC Owned Television Stations Group, a unit of Disney, to a template Frequency Relocation Agreement for each ABC-owned station and a Group Reimbursement Agreement covering ABC’s station group relocation-related expenses. On May 25, 2006, Mr. Martin, Ms. Fox, and I discussed this BAS relocation agreement in a meeting with Heather Dixon, Legal Advisor to Chairman Kevin Martin.
