**Re: NOTICE OF EX-PARTE COMMUNICATION**

***In the Matter of Federal-State Joint Board on Universal Service, et. al.,  
CC Docket Nos. 96-45, 98-171, 90-571, 92-237, 99-200, 95-116, 98-170,  
02-33, 95-20, and 98-10.***

Dear Ms. Dortch:

On June 2, 2006, Bob Quinn, Christopher Heimann, and I (all of AT&T Inc.) met with Scott Deutchman of Commissioner Copps' office to discuss the above referenced proceeding.

In particular, AT&T stressed that reform of the universal service contribution methodology is long overdue and urged adoption of reforms consistent with AT&T's telephone number/connection proposal.<sup>1</sup> AT&T pointed out that, if the FCC merely extends the current revenues-based system to VoIP and increases the wireless safe harbor, such measures would not only fail to address the fundamental flaws of the current system but, worse yet, could actually slow much needed reform. Should the FCC take such steps, it should do so *only* as part of a transition plan for comprehensive reform.
