Dear Ms. Dortch:

Yesterday, Larry Hartigan, Jennifer McCarthy, Mike Meece, and I met with Aaron Goldberger, Legal Advisor to Commissioner Deborah Taylor Tate, regarding the above-referenced proceeding, which concerns QUALCOMM's Petition for Declaratory Ruling relating to its MediaFLO network.

We gave Mr. Goldberger an update on the progress that has been made in the launch of MediaFLO, including: a) MediaFLO was demonstrated live, over-the-air throughout Las Vegas during the CTIA and NAB conventions; b) the demonstrations included eight MediaFLO-enabled phone models manufactured by six of the world's leading handset vendors; c) Verizon Wireless will be the first wireless carrier to provide MediaFLO service to its subscribers around the country; and, d) in accordance with the Commission's rules, QUALCOMM has continued to reach agreements with potentially affected TV/DTV stations—the Commission approved agreements that permit MediaFLO to launch in the Chicago market, for example. We emphasized, however, that the highly beneficial and innovative MediaFLO service cannot be launched as planned unless the Commission rules promptly on QUALCOMM's Petition for Declaratory Ruling.

We also provided Mr. Goldberger with a copy of the attached written ex parte letter and discussed the points made therein. We urged the Commission to issue a ruling promptly granting QUALCOMM's Petition for Declaratory Ruling.
