
**Re: *Ex Parte* Notice in IB Docket Nos. 02-364, 05-220, and 05-221**



- Globalstar's future heavily depends on how the FCC resolves pending spectrum issues
  - Decline to require any further L-band sharing with Iridium
  - Reinstate Globalstar's 2 GHz license and afford Globalstar access to a portion of the 2 GHz MSS spectrum
  - Favorable consideration of Globalstar's petition to expand its ATC authority to encompass all of its assigned spectrum.
