Pursuant to Section 1.1206(b)(2) of the Commission's Rules, this is to notify you that on June 27, 2006, Steve Sharkey and Rob Kubik of Motorola met with Julius Knapp, Jamison Prime, Geraldine Matise, Ira Keltz, Ron Chase, Jeff Dygert and Ahmed Lahjouji of the Office of Engineering and Technology regarding the above captioned proceeding.

During the meeting Motorola discussed the attached presentation. Motorola supported its previously filed position that the Commission should eliminate the requirement for a contention based protocol. In order to provide the highest use of this spectrum for broadband access, the FCC should issue non-exclusive licenses in the rural areas and should issue exclusive licenses in the non-rural areas (top 50 markets) where the density of use is greatest and the difficulty of coordinating with incumbent satellite operations will have the biggest impact on operations. The Commission should also change the out-of-band emission mask for frequencies above 3700 MHz to facilitate sharing with satellite downlink operations in the adjacent band.
