Dear Ms. Dortch:

On July 1, 2005, Fones4All Corporation (“Fones4All”) filed a “Petition for Expedited Forbearance Under 47 U.S.C. § 160(c) and section 1.53 of the Commission’s Rules” (“Petition”) asking the Commission to exercise its forbearance authority under section 10 of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended (the “Act”), 47 U.S.C. § 160 to forbear from application of section 51.319(d) of the Commission’s rules.¹

Section 10(c) of the Act provides that: “Any such petition shall be deemed granted if the Commission does not deny the petition for failure to meet the requirements for forbearance under subsection (a) within one year after the Commission receives it, unless the one-year period is extended by the **Commission**. The Commission may extend the initial one-year period by an additional 90 days **if the Commission finds that an extension is necessary** to meet the requirements of subsection (a). The Commission may grant or deny a petition in whole or in part and shall explain its decision in writing.”²

July 1, 2006 marked the one year anniversary of the Commission’s receipt of the Fones4All Petition. Accordingly, since the Commission neither denied the Petition for failure to meet the requirements for forbearance, nor did the Commission find that it was “necessary” to extend the initial one-year deadline to consider the Petition by 90 days, the Petition is effectively deemed granted as of July 1, 2006.

In accordance with the Commission’s rules, 47 C.F.R. Sec. 1.1206(b)(1), Fones4All is electronically filing in the above-referenced docket this letter.
