A summary of KALW's facilities movements in since 1989:

The Loma Prieta earthquake of October 17, 1989 severely damaged the John O'Connell High School building in San Francisco where KALW's office and broadcast studios were located. Within days emergency officials condemned the building as unsafe and ordered KALW out.

We quickly relocated the on air studios on a temporary basis to the transmitter site of radio station KSFO with their permission. This site was on the edge of San Francisco Bay and next to a rendering plant.

The office was quickly packed into available boxes and moved to the girls locker room of a nearby abandoned high school gymnasium several miles from the studios of the station.

This situation lasted until more permanent (but still temporary) facilities could be build on the basketball court of the abandoned gymnasium. The station, with studios and offices united once again, started broadcasting from these facilities under the backboards in the spring of 1991.

Since this was never considered to be the permanent new home for the station, and the staff never knew exactly when a permanent site would be built, much of the files of the station remained in moving boxes in the back of the gymnasium.

This situation lasted until December 1996 when KALW moved into and began broadcasting from its' new permanent facilities located at Burton High School.
