Withdrawal of Request for Waiver of Replication/Maximization
Interference Protection Deadline**

Dear Ms. Dortch:

On behalf of KRCA License, Corp., the permittee of digital television (“DTV”) station KRCA, Riverside, California (Facility Id. #22161), we hereby respectfully withdraw KRCA’s July 3, 2006 request for waiver of the replication/maximization interference protection deadline (the “Waiver Request”).¹

As noted in the Waiver Request, on June 16, 2006, KRCA filed an application to modify the station’s DTV construction permit (the “Modification Application”).² On July 3, CDDBS indicated that the Modification Application was still pending. Accordingly, KRCA requested waiver of the replication/ maximization interference protection deadline so that it could await grant of the Modification Application and complete construction of KRCA-DT’s modified facilities.

KRCA was advised today that the Commission has granted the Modification Application. The Waiver Request was therefore unnecessary, because the construction permit for KRCA does not expire until January 6, 2007. KRCA-DT is not subject to the July 2006 replication/ maximization interference protection deadline and instead must satisfy its replication/maximization requirements by January 6, 2007.³ KRCA therefore respectfully withdraws the Waiver Request.
