

1. Remove the CW requirement for HF. CW did not add much, if any, value to the Amateur response. Removal should help increase the number of HF operators, which made significant contributions.
2. Expedite the removal of all modes from the Rules; regulate only on bandwidth. Few, if any, of the modes mentioned by name in the Rules were of much value.
3. Remove Section 97.407, radio amateur civil emergency service. This provision is confusing and does not foster development of coordinated response plans on a national level.
4. Permit Amateurs of General class or above to own and operate low power AM and FM broadcast stations intended for rapid deployment. Such stations would not be subject to fixed infrastructure requirements, such as the Emergency Alert System. Such stations would be of great value in devastated areas for officials to communicate with the local citizenry should regular commercial stations not survive or are too distant for local needs.
5. Ability to offer some form of secure messaging.
