Dear Ms. Dortch:

This letter discloses a permitted *ex parte* contact in the above-referenced dockets. On July 27, 2006, undersigned counsel for Centennial Communications, accompanied by Mr. William Roughton, Centennial's Vice President, Legal & Regulatory Affairs, met with Mr. Fred Campbell of Chairman Martin's office. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss Centennial's comments and reply comments filed in the above-referenced dockets.

Centennial's representatives explained that, as set out in Centennial's filings, Centennial favors a requirement that technically compatible CMRS carriers enter into automatic roaming arrangements, with the details to be worked out by carrier negotiations, with the Commission available formally or informally to resolve disputes.

Centennial explained that the legal analysis of whether automatic roaming should be required should take place from the perspective of the needs of the end user customer seeking to roam. From this perspective, the "home" carrier seeking to establish roaming arrangements is best viewed as acting on behalf of those end users. This perspective leads to the conclusion that Section 201(a) of the Act, requiring that service be provided upon reasonable request for it, is a sound basis for establishing an automatic roaming requirement.
