PSAPs send/verify shape files

A single shape file will be used for a PSAP jurisdiction, unless the PSAP or its County Coordinator has informed DGS by May 19 that the PSAP would rather use multiple ESNs. During the week of May 22, DGS will post to its website a list of PSAP jurisdictions that have elected to use multiple ESNs for interim deployment.

By May 16, DGS will have notified PSAPs/County Coordinators that have received shape files that they have until May 26 to verify/send alternate files to the VPC; if no response is provided by May 26, VoIP 911 services will be deployed using existing data. After a VPC makes a future shape file request, all other PSAPs/County Coordinators will have three weeks to very/send alternate shape files to the VPC, or VoIP 911 services will be deployed using existing data.

VPCs obtain ESQKs

DGS will propose an ESQK assignment formula for each VPC by May 11. The ILECs and VPCs have until close of business on May 15 to provide comments on the assignment formulas. DGS will report on the status of formula development by May 19.

LECs build shell records

The Format used for a PSAP's shell records will be the version currently used by the PSAP, unless an ILEC establishes by no later than May 26 that the PSAP's Format will be updated before June 10. VPCs will propose template shell records and V-ALI displays by or before May 19. LECs will have until May 24 to provide comments on the template records. DGS expects that any decisions related to template shell records will be finalized by May 26. ILECs will build and upload data into the shell records by June 5.

Testing conducted

DGS will post a list of PSAPs ready for testing on its website. A PSAP must be given at least one week's notice prior to testing, unless the PSAP voluntarily agrees to earlier testing. The VPC will report test results to DGS and the applicable County Coordinator.

Deploy

Deployment will be conducted on a shape-by-shape basis if multiple shape files are used for a single PSAP jurisdiction.
