Dear Ms. Dortch:

On August 15, 2006, Edward J. Zander, Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of Motorola, Inc., spoke with Chairman Kevin Martin about Comcast's request for waiver of the integration ban for certain low-cost, limited-capability set-top boxes, including Motorola's DCT-700.

Mr. Zander reiterated Motorola's strong support for the Comcast waiver request and discussed with Chairman Martin: (1) the limited functionality of the DCT-700; (2) the many public interest benefits of granting the waiver request; (3) the many consumer harms associated with not granting the request; and (4) the absence of harms to the consumer electronics industry associated with a waiver grant. Mr. Zander urged the Commission to give prompt approval to the waiver request, consistent with comments filed previously in this proceeding by Motorola.
