Yesterday, representatives of Qwest Communications Corporation (“QCC”) and OnFiber Communications Inc. (“OnFiber”) met with members of the Wireline Competition Bureau (“WCB”) in connection with the above-referenced docket. The issues discussed were consistent with the information submitted by QCC and OnFiber in the docket, including the nature of and extent to which third party fiber facilities would continue to be available to competitors post-transaction. The parties also discussed the status of other regulatory approvals sought in connection with the transfer of control of OnFiber to QCC, and the timetable for Commission review of the transaction. Melissa Newman, Vice President, Qwest Communications International Inc., and I attended on behalf of QCC. Attending via teleconference on behalf of OnFiber was Jonathan Radin, Vice President – Legal & External Affairs.
