Please be advised that on September 4, 2006, Ronald E. Obray, President of Hands On Video Relay Services, Inc. (“HOVRS”) responded to an email inquiry by FCC Attorney-Advisor Gregory Hlibok concerning pending proceedings at the FCC relating to who Spanish to ASL VRS.

Mr. Hlibok asked questions concerning HOVRS’s experience in establishing a pool of ASL-Spanish interpreters and peak hours for ASL-Spanish VRS usage. Mr. Obray provided certain confidential and proprietary information on HOVRS operations. He also expressed the view that any VRS provider wanting to provide ASL-Spanish VRS should be required to provide such services 24 hours a day seven days a week and to satisfy the VRS speed of answer requirement.
