On September 28, 2006, Christopher Guttman-McCabe, Vice President, Regulatory Affairs, Brian Josef, Director, Regulatory Affairs, and Jeff Simmons, Director, Technology Programs, CTIA – The Wireless Association®, along with Mark Gibson and Chris Holt of Comsearch and Tom Dombrowsky of Wiley, Rein & Fielding, LLP, met with Fred Campbell, legal advisor to Chairman Kevin J. Martin. In a separate meeting later that day, the same CTIA, Comsearch and Wiley, Rein & Fielding representatives met with Joel Taubenblatt, Peter Daronco, Peter Corea, Ron Repasi, Linda Ray and Mary Schultz of the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau's Broadband Division. In both meetings, CTIA discussed issues relating to the relocation of private and common carrier microwave, BRS and MSS incumbents in the 2.1 GHz band and federal government incumbents in the 1.7 GHz band resulting from the Commission's Advanced Wireless Services ("AWS") auction.

During the meetings, CTIA noted the success of the recently-concluded AWS auctions and the wireless industry's strong interest in rolling out AWS networks and services as quickly as possible. CTIA explained its efforts working with numerous federal government agencies regarding frequency coordination and highlighted its cost-sharing clearinghouse proposal. In discussing post-auction processes and procedures, CTIA urged the Commission to act expeditiously in reviewing any potential petitions to deny, releasing a Public Notice of applications accepted for filing, and issuing licenses and transferring funds to the Office of Management and Budget.
