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these projects. Corr Wireless will use federal high-cost universal service support to assist it in completing these projected improvements.

The capital projects set forth on **Confidential Appendix A-2** will result in significant improvements within the Designated Areas which exceed the expected levels of universal service support to be received by Corr Wireless in each year. Notably, the capital improvement projects on **Confidential Appendix A-2** reflect only the projected capital expenses, and do not include the associated projected ongoing operating and maintenance expenses to be incurred following the capital investments. As reflected on **Confidential Appendix A-2**, Corr Wireless anticipates constructing the following additional cell sites to serve the Designated Areas:

Moreover, the projected capital improvements to the MSC will benefit all areas comprising the Designated Areas since a single MSC provides service to all wire centers. All MSC capital improvements have been allocated to the wire centers in the Designated Areas based on the number of cell sites in the particular wire center.⁶ The total projected capital expenditures and the amount of capital expense in excess of estimated universal service support over the term of the Service Improvement Plan is summarized as follows:

⁶ All wire centers comprising the Designated Areas are included within the Service Improvement Plan. Due to the nature of radio transmissions, a cell site is capable of providing coverage to other wire centers. Therefore, not all wire centers have a cell site physically located within the wire center boundaries due to signal propagation from an adjacent site. Therefore, certain wire centers are not listed on **Confidential Appendix A-2**. These wire centers are _____. The selection of these capital improvement projects is based on the Company's evaluation of many factors, including current consumer demand, competitive forces, current network facilities, available capital, and others. As these factors change, Corr Wireless will reevaluate and modify its improvement projects accordingly. Similarly, the order in which these facilities are to be constructed has not been finally determined and will be revised over time, and factors beyond the Company's control may result in modifications to planned projects or timelines. As a result, the content and timing of the projects in **Confidential Appendix A-2** is subject to change.

V. OPERATING EXPENSES

Since Corr Wireless first began providing service in the State of Alabama, the Company has developed a robust network throughout its licensed service areas and currently provides service to a substantial number of subscribers within its Designated Areas. Attached as **Confidential Appendix A-3** is a brief description of the types and locations of facilities the Company currently operates in the State of Alabama.

Corr Wireless' projected service coverage, quality and capacity capital improvements set forth in this Service Improvement Plan represent a substantial capital investment in new facilities and services based on the projected receipt of federal high-cost universal service support. Pursuant to Section 254(e) of the Act, the Company will utilize the federal high-cost universal service support it receives to operate, maintain and upgrade these network facilities and services

consistent with the universal service objective of providing quality telecommunications services in rural and high-cost areas and to low-income subscribers. Attached as **Confidential Appendix A-4** is a spreadsheet describing the projected operating costs and maintenance/repair expenses associated with the provision of service and the maintenance or repair of facilities within the Designated Areas in Alabama over the term of the Plan.

VI. EMERGENCY SERVICE IMPROVEMENTS

The value of mobile telecommunications services, particularly the availability of access to emergency services, can mitigate the unique risks of geographic isolation associated with living in rural communities.⁷ Although Corr Wireless has already implemented a comprehensive emergency preparedness program, the Company projects utilizing federal high-cost universal service support to purchase or lease additional microwave and standby power facilities to improve the reliability of the network access to emergency services in the Designated Areas. Corr Wireless also projects it will utilize federal high-cost support to complete network upgrades as needed to deploy E-911 as it receives requests from the local Public Safety Answering Points (“PSAPs”) within its Designated Areas. The Company’s projected expenditures for certain emergency service improvements within the Designated Areas are set forth on **Confidential Appendix A-2**.

VII. ANNUAL PROGRESS REPORT

Due to changes in consumer demand, regulatory requirements, technology improvements and other factors, Corr Wireless’ Service Improvement Plan is subject to modification and

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amendment. In addition, Corr Wireless' proposed deployment schedule may be adjusted depending upon the amount of federal high-cost support it receives and the timing of its receipt of such support. As required by the Commission, pursuant to Section 54.209(a)(1) of the Commission's Rules, Corr Wireless will file, on or before October 1, 2007, a progress report on its Service Improvement Plan. As noted above, the Company's identification of projects in the Service Improvement Plan has been based on the information available to it today, and is subject to change. Projected expenses are estimates, and actual expenses may vary significantly from these estimates. Corr Wireless' October 1, 2007 progress report will reflect amendments, modifications, and adjustments that occur between now and that time.

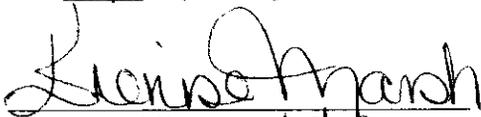

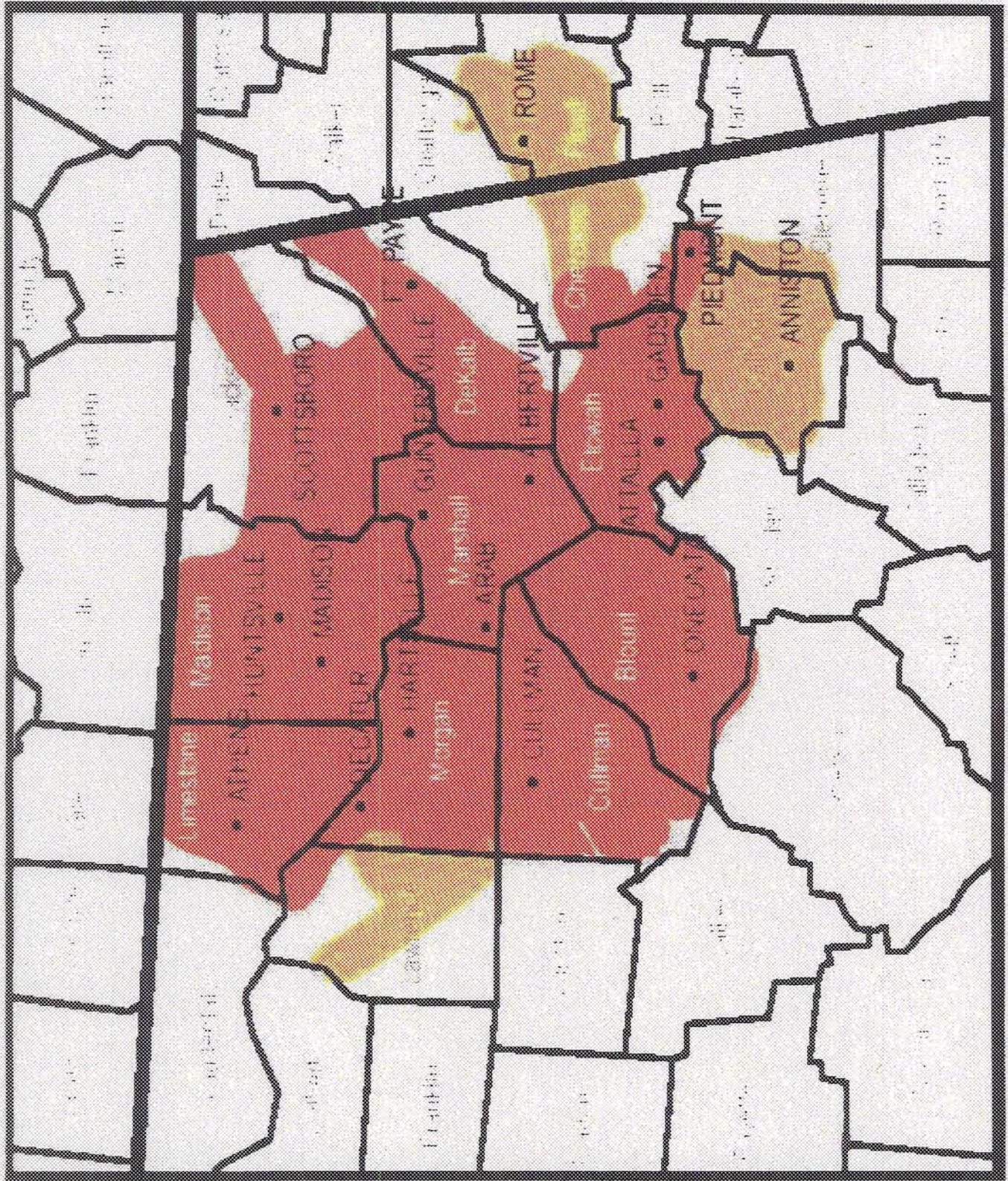

CORR WIRELESS SERVICE PLANS IN ALABAMA

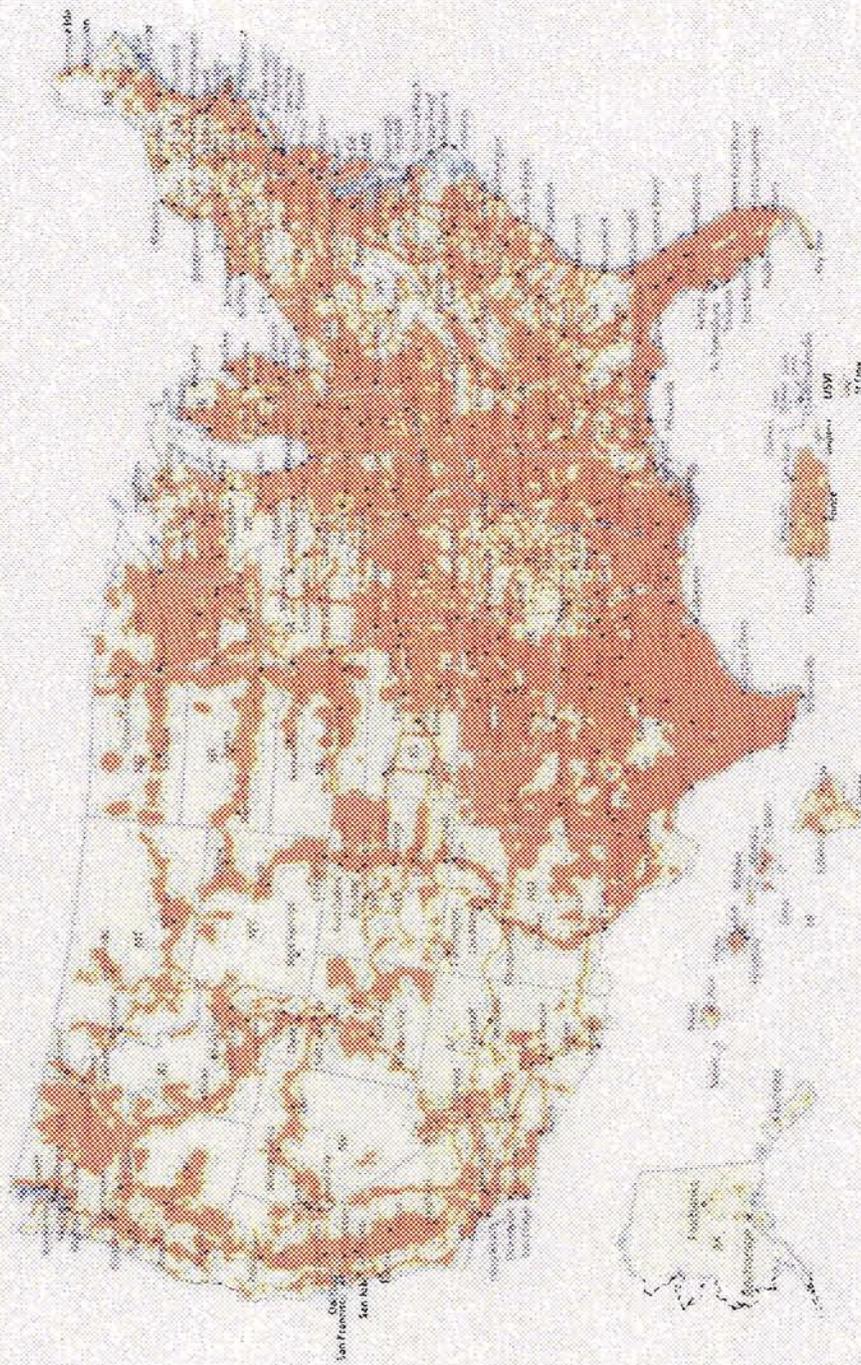
