**Re: Ex Parte Comments of Mobile Relay Associates - WT Docket No. 02-55**

Dear Ms. Dortch:

On January 24, 2006, Mobile Relay Associates (“MRA”) filed with the Commission, in the above-referenced rule making proceeding, a Petition for Partial Waiver of Rebanding Rules (“Waiver Request”), which Petition remains pending.<sup>1</sup> Subsequently, in late January 2006, several other parties filed petitions seeking reconsideration of the Commission’s October 5, 2005 *Memorandum Opinion and Order*<sup>2</sup> in this same proceeding, which petitions also remain pending. MRA requests that the Commission consolidate its Waiver Request with the later-filed petitions for reconsideration, and address and resolve all of these matters in a single order. Such consolidation is logical and would preserve the time and resources of the Commission.
