Dear Ms. Dortch:

On October 5, 2006, Christopher Guttman-McCabe, Vice-President, Regulatory Affairs, Michael Altschul, Senior Vice President and General Counsel, Paul Garnett, Assistant Vice-President, Regulatory Affairs, and Brian Josef, Director, Regulatory Affairs, CTIA-The Wireless Association®, met with Michelle Carey, Senior Legal Advisor to Chairman Kevin J. Martin to discuss the Commission's *Notice of Proposed Rulemaking* to enhance security and authentication standards for access to Customer Proprietary Network Information ("CPNI"). CTIA stated that its members fully share the goal of protecting customer privacy and deterring data brokers from fraudulently obtaining call records. CTIA reiterated the concerns and recommendations it raised in its comments and reply comments in the docket.

In addition, CTIA raised two universal service items for Ms. Carey's attention. Specifically, CTIA urged quick Commission action on the CTIA and Cingular Wireless Petitions for Declaratory Ruling on Universal Service Contribution Obligations, filed August 1 and August 8, 2006, respectively. Finally, CTIA noted its intention to file comments generally supporting the use of reverse auctions to determine high-cost universal service support (WC Docket No. 05-337; CC Docket No. 96-45).
