**Request for Extension of Time from

The issue of the ownership of broadcast media is a very significant issue for American society. All of the parties in these dockets can probably agree that ample time must be provided for all participants to express their views and make their case on media ownership.

**An Important Problem**

There is an important problem that has appeared in this proceeding. The written comment period is closing now (October 23, 2006) and only one of the public meetings has been conducted. This results in the public meetings

continuing while all the other parties are blocked from making additional written comments to the record.

This is an unfortunate situation because it prevents interested parties from making comments in writing in response to verbal comments made by the participants at the public meetings. As a result of this, those people who cannot afford to attend one or more of the public meetings have less opportunity to express themselves than those who do attend the meetings.

This imbalance should be corrected by keeping the comment period open for as long as the public meetings on media ownership are being held. When the public meetings are finally finished, the comment period can be closed. This will put all of the participants in these dockets on the same “level playing field”.

**Requested Action**

The Commission should keep the comment period for written comments open until two weeks after the last public meeting has been held.
