The Telecommunications Regulatory Board of Puerto Rico was created by the Puerto Rico Legislature in September 1996 to promote competition and safeguard the public interest.

The Board has undertaken major initiatives to promote competition and protect the consumer: a major proceeding to reduce intrastate access rates; fourteen interconnection arbitrations; forty interconnection agreement approvals.

But, while competition has increased and is clearly developing, improvement in quality of service is slow and telephone penetration averages only 60.9%.

The Board is extremely concerned that transfer of control of PRTC will have a serious negative impact on the promotion of competition and protection of the consumer.

America Móvil has given no credible assurance that it will improve quality of service for consumers and competitors.

Therefore the Board recommends adoption of Regulations for Quality Service Measurement and Reporting, developed by Telcordia Technologies and based on FCC, State and NARUC quality measurement programs. Any approval of the transfer of control of PRTC must be conditioned on these or similar performance measures. We also recommend that the Commission condition approval on a program of significant investment in expansion and improvement, over the next five years, of both the wireline and wireless networks.
