Hearing Aid Compatibility Report

RSA 1 Limited Partnership d/b/a Cellular 29 Plus and Iowa RSA 2 Limited Partnership d/b/a Lyrix (“Cellular 29 and Lyrix”), by their attorneys, pursuant to the Federal Communications Commission’s (“Commission” or “FCC”) *Order* in WT Docket No. 01-309,¹ and the subsequent *Public Notice* in the same proceeding,² hereby file their Sixth Report detailing their efforts towards compliance with the FCC’s hearing aid compatibility requirements. Cellular 29 and Lyrix are including in their Sixth Report all information of which they have knowledge, but do not address those reporting requirements in the *Order* that can be adequately answered only by the individual handset manufacturers.

I. Carrier Background

Cellular 29 and Lyrix are small, rural commercial mobile radio service (“CMRS”) providers under the same management and must depend upon secondary market handset wholesalers for access to new handsets.

II. Handsets Currently Offered for Sale

Cellular 29 and Lyrix currently offer for sale handsets manufactured by Kyocera, LG, Motorola, and Nokia. The specific handset models are the KX1 (Soho), KX9 (Milan); LG 5000, 4270, and 6100; Motorola V262, V265, V266, 343, W315, RAZR V3C, and V710; and the Nokia 6015 and 6255. The Kyocera, LG, and Motorola CDMA handset models have been certified by the FCC’s Office of Engineering and Technology as meeting at least a U3 rating and are therefore hearing aid compatible (HAC) compliant. On September 14, 2006, Cellular 29 and

Lyrix requested a temporary and limited waiver of Section 20.19(d)(2) of the Commission's rules until January 1, 2007 in order to gain more time to acquire and begin selling T-coil ("T-rated") HAC-compliant handsets. Cellular 29's and Lyrix's January 1, 2007 timetable for T-rated compliance is based on their experiences and contacts with manufacturers and distributors and publicly available information regarding handset availability.

III. Hearing Aid Compatible Handset Labeling/Insert Requirement

The Kyocera, LG, and Motorola handsets have a label attached on the handset's packaging indicating the U-rating of the wireless telephone. In addition, both the Kyocera KX9, LG handsets, and Motorola 710 contain inserts describing the U-rating system. None of the other handsets that Cellular 29 and Lyrix offer for sale have a label indicating the U-rating or an insert describing the U-rating system.

IV. Outreach Efforts

Cellular 29 and Lyrix are educating their subscribers, and any potential subscribers, on the functionality of the hearing aid compatible handsets it sells. In addition, Cellular 29 and Lyrix offer all of their customers a fifteen day return policy.
