

I would like to express my opposition to the FCC's policy of giving lower priority to Low Power radio stations. Apart from being unfair, retaining the power to remove a local radio station from the airwaves to make room for commercial broadcast has a chilling effect on the right to free speech.

Low Power stations, Bloomington Indiana's WIUX in particular, serve a valuable purpose to the communities in which they broadcast, and local programming, whether Low Power or Class A, should have an equal right to continue to broadcast.



I would like to express my opposition to the FCC's policy of giving lower priority to Low Power radio stations. 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


Dear FCC,

Low Power stations, Bloomington Indiana's WIUX in particular, serve a valuable purpose to the communities in which they broadcast, and local programming, whether Low Power or Class A, should have an equal right to continue to broadcast.

I am a recent Indiana University graduate who worked at WIUX for three of my four years of college. When I started there as a sophomore, it was WIUS AM 1570, which had to be listened to online because the broadcast radius was less than a mile. When I was a junior, we found out that the paperwork filed years earlier came through, making it possible for us to become a low-power FM station with a broadcast radius of almost 15 miles. After a major fundraising, we raised the money, bought the equipment, and became WIUX 100.3 LP-FM. The fact that the station is now on the verge of surrendering its hard-earned FM frequency absolutely breaks my heart, because it was not just a labor of love for me, but for people that were part of my family at IU. The kids that run the station belong there. Other kids have intramurals, religious groups, and other organizations, but this is all these kids have. The station is in a crappy old house near the Indiana Memorial Union that could be easily overlooked, but it is a gathering place for all walks of life looking to learn how to run a radio station and have some fun doing it. I made friends with so many different kinds of people there, from the sports broadcasting boys to the independent rock kids, and I was thereby turned on to a whole new world there that I cannot imagine my college experience without. I have tried here, but I really can't put into words what this station and all it stands for mean to me. Please, save WIUX and its deserving students.



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
