JOINT REPORT

1. The Enforcement Bureau, Commercial Radio Service, Inc., and Timothy M. Doty (collectively, the "Parties"), pursuant to the Presiding Judge's *Order*, FCC 06M-35 (released October 24, 2006), hereby jointly submit this report to the Presiding Judge about the status of their settlement discussions.


2. The Parties represent that they have made progress toward negotiating the various terms and conditions of a comprehensive agreement that would result in the universal settlement of this proceeding. Several discussions have been held among the Parties during which various terms and conditions were presented for deliberation. While there exists at least one significant element about which there is still disagreement, the

Parties believe that it would be worthwhile to continue negotiations aimed at settling this case. Toward this end, it is the collective hope and expectation among the Parties that they will be able to execute a comprehensive settlement agreement and be in a position to present it to the Presiding Judge, if at all, within the next 30 days.

3. Accordingly, the Parties respectfully request the Presiding Judge to grant them additional time within which to conclude their negotiations, execute a settlement agreement, and present a settlement package to the Presiding Judge for his consideration. Such an extension is in the public interest because a settlement in this case, if approved, would obviate the need for a protracted hearing, thereby conserving valuable public and private resources.

4. Commercial Radio Service, Inc. and Timothy M. Doty, by their respective counsel, represent that they have read this Joint Report, concur with the representations therein, and have authorized the undersigned to file this Joint Report on their behalf.


