


Dear FCC,





I am in favor of your granting reconsideration to WIUX's pending Petition for Reconsideration (Docket 06-77). This Bloomington, Indiana community radio station is a highly valuable resource to the Indiana University community, and to the broadcasting industry in general. It provides students in radio broadcasting with an opportunity to actually perform broadcasting. This is vital to the future of this important industry as it trains our future broadcasters, technicians and related personnel. WIUX also provides high value to the Bloomington community through its unique news and special programs.

WIUX is a so-called "Low Power station". The planned increase in broadcasting power of a Class A station in Bloomington will be destructive to WIUX. This is apparently based on a policy that favors Class A stations over Low Power stations. This policy, and its application with respect to WIUX in particular, is unwise and contrary to the public interest. 


Dear FCC,



I would like to express my opposition to the FCC's policy of giving lower priority to Low Power radio stations. This policy is patently unfair. It places priority on commercial stations and deprives the public of small, volunteer-run stations that provide local, educational and eclectic programming that can not be found elsewhere on the radio.


