COMMENTS INVITED ON REGION 27 (NEVADA) 800 MHz REGIONAL PLANNING COMMITTEE PUBLIC SAFETY PLAN AMENDMENT

On August 16, 2006, the Region 27 (Nevada) 800 MHz (821-824/866-869 MHz) Regional Planning Committee¹ submitted a proposed amendment to the Region 27 National Public Safety Planning Advisory Committee (NPSPAC) Plan for review and approval.² Region 27 states that its original plan has become outdated due to the population growth in Nevada and changes in public safety communications technology. The Plan Amendment includes the following changes to better align the NPSPAC 800 MHz public safety spectrum with the needs of the public safety agencies of Nevada:

- Corrects typographical errors in the original Plan;
- Better defines eligible entities;
- Acknowledges (and incorporates) waiver previously approved by the Commission;³
- Updates the Region 27 geographic and demographic descriptions;
- Refines the methodology used to allocate frequencies;
- Repacks the frequency allocation tables to align with actual licenses and requirements; and
- Emphasizes federal recommendations regarding homeland security and interoperability.

The proposed amendment was reviewed by, and letters of concurrence obtained from, Nevada's adjacent regions, Region 3 (Arizona), Region 5 (Southern California), Region 6 (Northern California), Region 12 (Idaho), Region 41 (New Mexico) and Region 35 (Oregon).

In accordance with the National Public Safety Plan, each region is responsible for planning its use of public safety radio frequency spectrum in the 821-824/866-869 MHz bands.⁴ The Region 27 Plan was originally adopted by the Commission in January 1993.⁵

Prior to taking action on the Region 27 Plan Amendment, by this Public Notice, we solicit comments on the Plan Amendment. Pursuant to Sections 1.415 and 1.419 of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. §§ 1.415, 1.419, interested parties may file comments on the Region 27 Plan Amendment on or before **December 22, 2006**, and reply comments on or before **January 8, 2007**. Comments may be filed electronically or by filing paper copies.⁶

Electronic Filers. Comments may be filed electronically using the Internet by accessing the ECFS: <http://www.fcc.gov/cgb/ecfs/> or the Federal eRulemaking Portal: <http://www.regulations.gov>. Filers should follow the instructions provided on the website for submitting comments. For ECFS filers, when completing the transmittal screen, filers should include their full name, U.S. Postal Service mailing address, and should reference **PR Docket No. 92-268**. Parties also may submit an electronic comment by Internet e-mail. To get filing instructions, filers should send an e-mail to ecfs@fcc.gov, and include the following words in the body of the message: "get form." A sample form and directions will be sent in response.

Paper Filers. Parties who choose to file by paper must file an original and four copies of each filing. Filings can be sent by hand or messenger delivery, by commercial overnight courier, or by first-class or overnight U.S. Postal Service mail (although we continue to experience delays in receiving U.S. Postal Service mail). All filings must be addressed to the Commission's Secretary, Office of the Secretary, Federal Communications Commission.
