On Wednesday, December 13, 2006, Christopher Guttman-McCabe, Vice-President, Regulatory Affairs, Michael Altschul, Senior Vice President and General Counsel, Paul Garnett, Assistant Vice-President, Regulatory Affairs, CTIA-The Wireless Association®, met with Barry Ohlson, Senior Legal Advisor, and Scott Bergmann, Legal Advisor to Commissioner Jonathan Adelstein to discuss the Commission's *Notice of Proposed Rulemaking* to enhance security and authentication standards for access to Customer Proprietary Network Information ("CPNI"). CTIA shared a copy of the recently enacted legislation, the "Telephone Records and Privacy Protection Act of 2006," a copy of which is attached. CTIA highlighted how this legislation will result in the criminal prosecution of those companies and individuals who engage in the act of pretexting, addressing through the legal system the anti-consumer behavior the Commission was attempting to address in this proceeding.

CTIA also reiterated that its members fully share the goal of protecting customer privacy and deterring data brokers from fraudulently obtaining call records. CTIA restated the concerns and recommendations it raised in its comments and reply comments in the docket.
