On December 4 and December 8, 2006, AT&T joined other industry and consumer representatives in a meeting convened by the FCC's Consumer and Governmental Affairs Bureau to discuss Telecommunications Relay Service fraud issues. On December 4, AT&T representatives included Celia Nogales, Gail Sanchez, David Claus and the undersigned; on December 8, Celia Nogales, Gail Sanchez, David Claus, Burt Bossi, Terry Feeney and the undersigned participated in the call. Participating from the FCC were Monica Desai, Jay Keithley, Tom Chandler and Greg Hlibok

As part of the discussions, AT&T reiterated points made in comments filed in the above referenced proceeding. AT&T supports a regulatory approach that relies on industry-approved standards for identifying and blocking fraudulent IP Relay calls, but does not support rules that require IP Relay providers to intercept and terminate suspected fraudulent calls or that require user registration. In the December 8 discussion, AT&T proposed the creation of a database that would contain IP addresses and address ranges that have been identified as using IP relay services in an inappropriate manner.
