

**Letter of Support for
WIUX-LP's Petition for Reconsideration on Docket 06-77**

Dear FCC,

I would like to express my opposition to the FCC's policy of giving lower priority to Low Power radio stations. Retaining the power to remove a local radio station from the airwaves to make room for commercial broadcast severely limits listeners to variety and constrains a great outlet of communication. In addition, many low frequency stations offer educational value as their limited financial resources create opportunity for volunteers. In the case of WIUX, a student-run radio station, I've found more radio- and music-loving students dedicated to pursuing their passion within the radio and music industry through than any mainstream radio station I've come across. While many high frequency stations limit the number of interns and have a strict policy regarding the type of personality they can portray, stations such as WIUX welcome diversity and rarely turn down anyone looking to further their skill set in this still-thriving industry.

Low Power stations, Bloomington Indiana's WIUX in particular, serve a valuable purpose to the communities in which they broadcast through and whether Low Power or Class A, should have an equal right to continue to broadcast. I hope you'll highly reconsider your position regarding prioritization of Low Power vs. High Power radio stations.
