Attached on behalf of M2Z Networks, Inc. ("M2Z") is a Motion for Leave to File a Consolidated Opposition. The attached Motion explains how the filing of initial comments, petitions to deny, or other pleadings on different dates would create multiple deadlines for the filing of oppositions and other responsive pleadings. M2Z believes that such a balkanized process is inconsistent with the interests of the Federal Communications Commission ("FCC") as it would place unintended and unnecessary administrative burdens upon FCC staff and parties to this proceeding. M2Z therefore seeks leave to file a consolidated response to initial pleadings no earlier than ten days after the deadline for filing such pleadings. As explained in the attached Motion, a consolidated opposition will avoid duplication or repetitious treatment of overlapping issues, thereby permitting more efficient analysis of issues in this proceeding by FCC staff and other parties.
