On February 15, 2007, representatives of Boston Scientific Corporation ("BSC") met with Commission staff to discuss the above-referenced proceedings. Specifically, Teresa D. Baer of Latham & Watkins LLP (counsel to BSC) met in person, and Beatrice M. Biebuyck (Director, Government and Corporate Regulatory Affairs), Ann Kraemer (Senior Counsel, Global Compliance Office), Jeff Cook (Patent Counsel) and Ron Reimann Jr. (Manager, Engineering Compliance) met by conference call, with Julius P. Knapp, Bruce A. Romano, Jamison S. Prime and Gary R. Thayer of the Office of Engineering & Technology ("OET"). At the meeting, consistent with its filings in these proceedings, BSC urged the adoption of a rule authorizing the operation of cardiac implants in the 90-110 kHz band or, alternatively, the extension of the temporary waiver previously granted to BSC.
