Dear Ms. Dortch:

On February 7, 2007, Representative Anna G. Eshoo, U.S. Congresswoman from California, sent a letter to Chairman Kevin J. Martin supporting M2Z Networks, Inc.'s ("M2Z") Application for License and Authority to Provide National Broadband Radio Service in the 2155-2175 MHz Band (the "Application"). Representative Eshoo's letter was subsequently included in the record of the above-referenced proceedings.

Representative Eshoo's letter explains that a recent study by the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development ("OECD") found that the U.S. ranks only 12th in the world in terms of broadband penetration, behind countries such as Korea, the Netherlands, and Iceland. In particular, the OECD found that only 19 people out of 100 in the U.S. have broadband Internet access. Consequently, despite current efforts to promote broadband services, the U.S. has fallen behind in making such services available to its people. M2Z's entry into the broadband market will provide an affordable service alternative to get even more Americans connected to the Internet. This result is undeniably in the public interest.

Accordingly, in the interests of establishing a more complete record in this proceeding and aiding the Commission in evaluating the public interest benefits of granting M2Z's Application, either directly or under the Commission's forbearance authority, the following data referenced in Representative Eshoo's letter is submitted herewith:
