**Re: M2Z Networks, Inc.**  
***Application for License and Authority to Provide National Broadband Radio Service in the 2155-2175 MHz Band; Petition for Forbearance under 47 U.S.C. § 160(c) to Permit Acceptance and Grant of Its Application***

Dear Ms. Dortch:

On February 12, 2007, Representative Michael M. Honda, U.S. Congressman from California, sent a letter to Chairman Kevin J. Martin supporting M2Z Networks, Inc.'s ("M2Z") Application for License and Authority to Provide National Broadband Radio Service in the 2155-2175 MHz Band (the "Application"). Representative Honda's letter was subsequently included in the record of the above-referenced proceedings.

Representative Honda's letter explains that a recent study released by the International Telecommunications Union ranked the U.S. only 16th in the world in terms of broadband penetration, behind countries such as China, Japan, and Canada. Specifically, the study found that in the U.S. only 11 persons per 100 have broadband service compared to 25 persons per 100 in top-ranked Korea. This study shows how the U.S. continues to lag behind its neighbors in terms of making broadband Internet access available to its people. M2Z's entry into the broadband market will provide an affordable service alternative to provide more Americans with improved Internet access. Without question, this result will serve the public interest.

Accordingly, in the interests of establishing a more complete record in this proceeding and aiding the Commission in evaluating the public interest benefits of granting M2Z's Application, either directly or under the Commission's forbearance authority, the following data referenced in Representative Honda's letter are submitted herewith:
