Dear Ms. Dortch:

On March 2, 2007, Peter Pitsch and Mike Chartier of Intel met with the following people from the FCC regarding the above proceeding: Julius Knapp, Jamison Prime, Geraldine Matise, Jeff Dygert, Ron Chase, Alan Stillwell and Ira Keltz of the Office of Engineering and Technology; and Jennifer Salhus, Gary Michaels and Paul Murray of the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau.

In the course of the meeting, Mssrs. Pitsch and Chartier expressed Intel's continuing concern that the 3650 to 3700 spectrum, especially in the affected major markets, should be licensed on an exclusive basis to foster

efficient use of this spectrum for long range applications. He stated that the best way to foster long range, wireless broadband deployment in areas where congestion is likely is to provide the opportunity for greater QoS and business certainty afforded by licensing. He said that a contention protocol could not enable high QoS for long range services in congested areas and would delay services. Therefore, the rules under reconsideration in this proceeding would foreclose the likelihood of this valuable use.
