

I oppose RM-11306 and therefore suggest a dismissal of any proposed bandwidth restrictions beyond what has currently been acceptable and endorsed by the FCC.

Furthermore, the proposed bandwidth restriction should be rejected in view of FCC part 97.1 (b), (c) & (d), the basis and purpose of the Amateur Radio service, as to avoid any confusion between true experimentation and potential commercial interests.

When the 10 meter band (and above) become viable operating frequencies again, and in light of the new licensees gaining privileges on these bands, there must be no signal bandwidth restrictions acting as a hindrance to these new experimenters.

Therefore, I reject all aspects of RM-11306 as an assault on an already well regulated amateur radio service.
