

On April 5, 2007, Bert Williams, Vice President, Tropos Networks, and I met with Mr. Bruce Gottlieb, Legal Advisor to Commissioner Copps. During the meeting we discussed the benefits of unlicensed spectrum and how Tropos technology has deployed competitive networks and expanded broadband access substantially. We related the importance of the above Commission proceedings that would expand unlicensed spectrum. The positions we advocated are set forth in Tropos comments and reply comments of January 31, 2007 and March 2, 2007, respectively and which are detailed in the TV white space dockets and in the Tropos *ex parte* communication of March 13, 2007, which is set forth in the 3650 MHz dockets.
