FCC Invites "Oppositions" on Two "Morse Proceeding Reconsideration Petitions (Apr 13, 2007) -- The FCC has invited opposition comments ("oppositions") to two petitions for reconsideration filed in the wake of the Commission's **Report & Order (R&O)** in WT Docket 05-235. That **R&O** altogether eliminated any Morse code examination element to obtain an Amateur Radio license. One petition calls on the FCC to reinstate the 5 WPM Morse code requirement for Amateur Extra class applicants. The second cites problems with the FCC Electronic Comment Filing System (ECFS) and seeks to have the Commission reopen the proceeding for an additional round of comments. Oppositions are due April 27 (comments in **support** of either petition are not welcome). Replies to oppositions -- i.e., comments on the opposition comments -- are due 10 days later. Petitioner Anthony R. Gordon, KG6EQM, of West Covina, California, contends that "significant national security implications" require that the Commission take another look at the issue.


MY COMMENTS TO THE FCC
