Notice of Detariffing of Common Carrier Broadband Internet Access Transmission Service

This is to notify the Federal Communications Commission (“FCC”) of SRT Communications, Inc.’s (“SRT”) decision to exit the National Exchange Carrier Association’s (“NECA”) Digital Subscriber Line (“DSL”) Tariff. SRT will offer all DSL access services on a Title II non-tariffed, common carrier basis outside of the NECA Tariff.

Effective July 1, 2007, SRT will no longer utilize the NECA DSL Tariff for any related broadband transmission facility used to provide customers an integrated wireline broadband Internet access and video service using DSL. Any Special Access arrangement used to provide interface to the Internet Service Provider network will remain in the NECA Special Access Tariff.

On May 18, 2007, SRT sent letters to its existing DSL access service customers notifying them that DSL related services will be priced out of a DSL Access Services Wholesale Rate Plan instead of the currently used NECA DSL Tariff. The DSL Access Services Wholesale Rate Plan will slightly increase the DSL Line Charge and DSL Term Plan Charge. Also, the currently utilized Volume Discount Pricing Plan will be eliminated along with the early termination fee. There are only minor revisions to the terms and conditions of DSL access services.

The notification letters indicate that a copy of the DSL Access Services Wholesale Rate Plan can be picked up at SRT Headquarters, and also may be viewed on SRT’s website at www.srt.com.
