

The government must protect our public airwaves from the same corporate gatekeepers that have stifled innovation and competition in Internet markets. The broadcast spectrum belongs to all of us and should be licensed only to those who serve all of us impartially.

To restore America's leadership in high-speed Internet services, the FCC must ensure that the upcoming auction sets aside at least 30 MHz (at a minimum) of spectrum for open and nondiscriminatory Internet access. That will guarantee that new entrants have the opportunity to enter the market in competition with incumbent providers.

It would be a big mistake to hand over these airwaves to the very same phone and cable companies that dominate the wireline market. We need more competition and innovation, not more of the same. This new wireless spectrum must be open and neutral so that America can build a better Internet for everyone.
