To restore America's leadership in high speed Internet services, the FCC must ensure that the upcoming auction sets aside at least 30 MHz of spectrum for open and non-discriminatory Internet access. Competition in this market will stimulate growth and give the United States an opportunity to catch up with much of the rest of the industrialized world.
